Criminal Law

Driving Under the Influence/DUI

Being arrested for a DUI can be one of the most difficult times of a person's life. A DUI can result in jail time, fines, and in a substantial driver's license suspension. It is extremely important that you understand all the consequences that can result from a DUI. Pennsylvania's DUI laws call for very specific penalties. Traffic Violations

In Pennsylvania, some traffic offenses carry mandatory license suspensions while others carry a significant number of points. When a driver reaches six points, restrictions will be placed on his or her license. Any traffic violation can substantially increase your insurance rates. You should review the penalties for pleading guilty to a traffic violation before signing anything. Our attorneys can tell you the outcome of a guilty plea and in many cases can negotiate a lesser penalty for you. If we cannot resolve the case, we

are prepared to fight the case through all appellate courts. Even if you have already pleaded guilty, it may not be too late to fight. As long as you act within 30 days of your plea, our attorneys can reopen your case and attempt to get you a better outcome.

License Suspensions

Protection From Abuse Orders

Having a PFA filed against you can be an embarrassing and devastating experience. If that PFA is not handled properly, a PFA order can permanently affect your child custody rights, could impact future employment, and will affect your firearms rights. It is important to have that PFA order reviewed by our attorneys before you enter into any type of agreement.

Juvenile Offenses

Obtaining an attorney in a Juvenile case is important as not all cases end at age 18 and a case in Juvenile Court can end up on an adult record, and can even affect future firearms rights.

Expungements

In the current internet age, schools, employers and state licensing agencies are doing

background checks more and more often. A minor offense as a juvenile or young adult can be the difference in getting a job. Not all juvenile offenses are sealed once a person turns 18. In many cases, Pennsylvania permits underage drinking convictions to be erased from your record. Pennsylvania also permits juvenile offenses and all summary offenses to be erased after at least five years from the offense.

Additionally, while you may have completed ARD, that completion does not mean that the offense is erased from your record. We are experienced in clearing peoples records so that they are able to put mistakes behind them.

Pardons

While you may have been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor in the past, Pennsylvania does permit you to have that offense removed from your record. In Pennsylvania, a person convicted of a more serious offense may request that the Governor remove that conviction from their record. Prince Law Offices is experienced in preparing Pardon applications and representing you in front of the Board of Pardons.

Firearms Rights

The United States Constitution recognizes your right to keep and bear arms as one of your most important rights.
